Quilt Show Rules

1. Entry is limited to the work of current Iowa Quilters Guild members. New members must have paid their dues by May 3, 2008.
2. Pre-registration is required. Entry forms must be postmarked no later than June 7, 2008.
3. Items must be checked in at the Perry Elementary School between 9:00 and 11:00 am on Monday, July 14, 2008 to be hung in the show. Martha Klatt, 1201 2nd St., Perry, IA 50220, 515-465-3294 must receive shipped quilts by July 7, 2008.
4. There is a \$2.00 entry fee per quilt due with the entry form. Each entrant will receive a free show pin. Monetary awards will be given for Special Awards and 1st place quilts. The Marilyn Christensen family has sponsored \$50 prizes for the top five awards. Challenge entries will be judged and must pay the \$2.00 entry fee.
5. All workmanship must be your own unless entered in the group or team quilt categories. A Team Quilt is made by only two people; a Group Quilt is made by more than two people. Only Iowa Quilt Guild members will be eligible for the Best Hand and Machine Quilting awards.
6. There is a limit of three entries for each quilt category regardless of the technique. Quilts may not have been previously entered and judged in an Iowa Quilt Guild quilt show.
7. According to the judge's discretion, First, Second, and Third place and Honorable Mention ribbons will be given in each technique in the category. Rosettes will be awarded for the following:
 - Best of Show—separate awards for Bed and Wall Quilts
 - Iowa Rose for Workmanship in Hand Quilting (IQG Members only)
 - Iowa Rose for Workmanship in Machine Quilting (IQG Members only)
 - Most Innovative Design
 - Viewer's Choice—separate awards for Bed and Wall Quilts
 - Judge's Recognition
 - Community Awards
 - Viewer's Choice for IQG Logo Challenge entries
8. If an item is entered in the wrong category or technique it will be moved to the correct category according to the discretion of the quilt committee. If moving a quilt results in more than three entries in the category, the moved quilt will be judged, but not considered for awards. Read the rules carefully.
9. Owners enter items at their own risk. Individuals are urged to see that their quilts are adequately insured under their home insurance coverage.
10. Ribbons will be placed on the quilts.
11. The judging chairman reserves the right to split a category with a large number of entries into smaller sections for judging and awards.
